A list of works cited, which appears at the end of your research paper, gives publication information for each of the sources you have cited in the paper. Start on a new page and title your list "Works Cited." Then list in alphabetical order all the sources that you have cited in the paper. Unless your instructor asks for them, do not include sources not actually cited in the paper even if you read them.

Alphabetize the list by the last names of the authors (or editors); if a work has no author or editor, alphabetize by the first word of the title other than A, An, or The.

Include full name of authors, with the last name first. Capitalize the first word, the last word, and all principle words in a title.

Do not indent the first line of each works cited entry, but indent any additional lines one-half inch (or five spaces). Double-space the entire list, both between and within entries.

Underline titles and subtitles of books; capitalize only the first word of the title and subtitle (as well as all proper nouns).

A book by a single author

Issacson, Paul. Monet: Le Dejeuner sur l'Herbe. London: Penguin Press, 1972.

Two or more books by the same author

To cite two or more books by the same author, give the name in the first entry only. Thereafter, in place of the name, type three hyphens, followed by a period and the title. If the person named is an editor, compiler, or translator, place a comma after the three hyphens and write the appropriate abbreviation.

NOTE: When citing familiar reference books, do not give full publication information. List only the edition and the year of publication.

NOTE: For scholarly journals that begin each issue on page 1, include the issue number to identify the source. Add a period and the issue number directly after the volume number, e.g., "27.2" to indicate volume 27, issue 2.
